Dear Highway:

A few lines from the City of Columbia, S. C., may be of more or less interest to the readers of the Highway at this time, more especially as it is a city in one of the sunny states of the South.

Columbia is the capital city of South Carolina and is a very pretty city with broad, well laid out streets, lined on either side with beautiful shade trees, and has broad sidewalks of cement. Columbia has a dozen or more churches of various denominations, nearly half of boasts of having a dozen or more hospihad the pleasure of baptizing four young tals, and strange as it may seem, they are which are colored people. This city also nearly always full of patients seeking healing from all the diseases to which human flesh is heir.

Down here we have some of nearly all the creeds known, even the Latter Day Saints, or more properly speaking, Mormons, for there is a difference between Mormons and Latter Day Saints.

The Columbians are much more given to Church going than the people in many other places. It is frequently difficult to get a seat unless one is early at the services. This cannot be said of any of the churches either North or in Canada, as far as my knowledge goes.

The climate here is quite different from the climate North or in Canada. For two months or more it has been exceptionally dry and hot even for the South, the thermometer having gone as high as 95. One remarkable thing about the climate is the very sudden changes from 60 and less to 90 and over, within a few hours, which makes it not any too healthful, especially for the northern people.

I may add that suicides, murders, fratricides, and all other cides are of frequent occurrences, with breach of promise cases thrown in.
