This question, asked by Christ Himself, was in His day satisfactorily answered, why ask it again—why any doubt or controversy today?

Readers, consider well the following testimonies:

1st—Testimony of the Father.

This is my Beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased.—Matt. 17-5.

2nd—Testimony of Christ Himself.

I am the Son of God.—St. John 10-36.

3rd—Testimony of the Spirit in the word.

The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.—Mark 1-1.

4th—Testimony of Angel Gabriel.

The Holy Ghost shall come upon thee, and the power of the Highest shall overshadow thee: therefore also that holy thing which shall be born of thee shall be called the Son of God.—St. Luke 1-35.

Nathaniel answered and saith unto him, Rabbi, thou art the Son of God.—St. John 1-49.

10th—Testimony of Martha.

She said unto Him: Yea, Lord: I believe that thou art the Christ, the Son of God.—St. John 11-27.

11th—Testimony of the Eunuch.

And Phillip said: If thou believest with all thy heart, thou mayest, and he answered and said: I believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God.—Acts 8:37.

12th—Testimony of Centurion.

And when the Centurion which stood over against Him, saw that he so cried out, and gave up the ghost, he said, "Truly this man was the Son of God.—St. Mark 15:39.

13th—Testimony of Unclean Spirits.

And unclean spirits, when they saw him, fell down before him, and cried, say-

ing, Thou art the Son of God.—St. Mark 3-11.

14th—Testimony of the Legion.
