Dear Highway:

It has been some time since we have seen in the columns of your valuable paper a report of any description whatever as emanating from anyone connected with our church. I will therefore, God helping me to thus give to the dear readers of the Highway a short report concerning not only the spiritual condition of our church, but also its prospective outlook for the future.

Some few months ago it will be remembered that owing to the serious illness of our pastor, Rev. S. A. Baker, he was obliged to give up his pastorate at Moncton. He then asked the church for a slave of absence for the remainder of the year. At a business session of the church this was granted. It was at this session that we extended to Rev. W. W. Howe a call to become our pastor to the close of the year, so after much consideration and prayer, Brother Howe accepted the call and he is now with us, and we appreciate this fact very much.

Brother Howe is strongly emphasizing the fact that the church should be a soul saving institution and should always be in good working condition and ready for battle at any moment. He has also been preaching some very strong sermons right on these lines that are having a telling effect upon us as a church. The people have been greatly awakened as to their possibilities and they are praying more earnestly for an outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us as a church and people.

We are not at all discouraged, not by any means, when we know assuredly that "the best of the land is yet before us." We are looking very optimistically to the future, still expecting that God will more abundantly bestow his blessing upon us, and thus give us the desire of our hearts. So we would ask the prayers of the dear readers of the Highway that God will give us victory in this part of his vineyard.
