IMPORTANT RESOLUTIONS PASSED AT ALLIANCE 1927

Resolved that we recommend to our Churches that they arrange for the holding of Sunday School Conventions in connection with the Sunday School work, and that they make their contributions toward the carrying out of this plan.

Resolved that the matter of holding Sunday School Conventions be left with the pastors in each district, and that they arrange for the holding of a convention at the time and place of each Quarterly Meeting.

Resolved that a committee be appointed to have Temperance Pledge Cards printed for use in our Sunday Schools, and that all the schools be urged to use the same.

In view of the fact that there is an undue tendency on the part of some of our churches to make frequent change of pastors, which we consider is often detrimental to the work, as well as both expensive and discouraging to the pastor,

Therefore, Resolved that we recommend to all our Churches, for the work's sake, that they be more considerate in this matter when calling a pastor. We would further recommend to the Church calling a pastor, that they defray his moving expenses.
