## CORRESPONDENCE.

Dear Highway:

Our special meetings closed last Sunday night. Upon the whole we had a splendid meeting. The Church was edified and strengthened. About twenty-five persons were forward for prayer, and nearly all claimed victory. One sister claimed to be sanctified and healed. At times the power of God was very manifest. Brother Percy Green preached every night, but Saturday nights, during the first three weeks. Sister Hazel Mullen preached on Saturday nights. We intended to close on Sunday, April 3rd, but the interest seemed so good, and conviction so deep on many who had not yielded, that we decided to go on for another week. Brother Green was with us two nights this week and over Sunday. Sister Hazel preached Monday and Tuesday nights with unction and power, to a crowded house, and saw seekers each night. On Wednesday she was taken ill, and was unable to attend the services until on Sunday night, when she came but was unable to stay.

I held the fort alone on Thursday and Friday night. The preaching of both Brother Green and Sister Mullen was of a high order and was much appreciated by the people. Sister Mullen's singing was an attraction to the meeting, and was greatly enjoyed.

As a result of the meeting, seven presented themselves for baptism. The baptismal service will take place next Sunday morning.

Sister Mullen's condition not being improved, the doctor was consulted, who ordered her to the Hospital at once. She left this morning for the Chipman Hospital at St. Stephen, N. B. The doctor pronounced her trouble appendicitis.

The Church as a whole stood by the work and there were meetings for prayer nearly every afternoon. There seemed to be conviction a plenty but very little yielding. It is both astonishing and alarming to behold the unbelief and resistance to the truths of God in this godless and world-bound age. We thank God for some victory, but still we must say that "The reaping was altogether out of proportion to the sowing."
