In the Highway of October 30th, in piece entitled "The Greater Work," by W. E. Smith, are these words: "Faith is not merely a receptive, submissive, subjective, passing attitude of the soul as some mystical writer declares. It is an active, dynamic, militant, aggressive power that dominates the whole personality of the individual, making him a conqueror. It overcomes the world. It subdues kingdoms and works righteousness. It is mighty through God to the pulling down of strongholds."

Let us look at the meaning of some of these words: Active means quick, lively. Dynamic, pertaining to strength, forceful militant, serving as a soldier, ready for war on sin.

The word militant struck me, and that takes in a whole lot—obedience, discipline, love for and faith in your commander. Not stopping to ask why, but knowing he does not command to do the impossible but will see us through.

THE UPWARD LOOK!

JESUS—The Author and finisher of our faith, for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and is set down at the right hand of the throne of God. Heb. 12:2.

MOSES (Heb. 11:24-27). Making his choice, putting a high estimation on the reproach of Christ, endured as seeing Him who is invisible.

WE (Heb. 13:14-13) are called to go forth unto Him without the Camp, bearing His reproach. (Read Ps. 69:7, 9 and 20).

PETER (Matt. 14: 23-33) seeing Jesus walking upon the water, cries: "Lord, if it be Thou, bid me to come unto Thee upon the water." At the command "Come," looking to Jesus, he walked on the water. But looking aside at the danger, he feared and sank. So we, in the crises of life.

Illustration—An ancient chariot with swords on the wheels. Either you rode in triumph on to victory, or you were crushed and mutilated beneath the wheels. So in trial, either by faith we triumph, and ride on through victory to greater blessing and joy, or we are crushed and mutilated by sore defeat.

Where we look, in trials, makes all the difference!

The secret of Victory as here set forth:

I. As Moses—choose! Make the final decision, the irrevocable surrender. Note what he sacrificed. . . a kingdom. . . the Kingdom which at that time ruled the known world.

II. Believe. By faith he endured as seeing Him who is invisible. The Altar sanctifies the gift. If you have made the surrender, believe and the fire falls, your heart is 'purified by faith' (Acts 15:9). The experience of perfect love thus wrought in your heart, "casteth out all fear" (John 4:18.) Therefore, perfect love, the experience of holiness enables us to keep our eyes on Jesus, and thus triumph.

III. Results in victory (II. Cor. 3:18. 4:6-16-18.)

IV. Changes our viewpoint. Illustration: Paul, when this happened to him (Acts 22:6-15) said: "I could not see for the glory of that light." Look at the sun. . . now turn your eyes where you will. . . the glory is on everything.

Look at Jesus. . . now look at your trials, difficulties environment and life in general. See the glory everywhere.

V. Changes us; from glory to glory (II. Cor. 3:18) into the same image.

VI. This change is wrought by the spirit of the Lord (Rom. 5:5) because the love of God is shed abroad in our hearts by the Holy Ghost which is given unto us. Just as the glory of the sun gets into our eyes by a steady look, so the glory of the Sun of Righteousness gets into our eyes, our hearts, our faces, by a steady look at Him.

This happens while we are on our knees in prayer; as we read His word—His face of beauty shines from every page—and as a result of the ministry of the Holy Spirit who has come to unveil His beauty to us. (John 14:26; 15:26; 16:13-15.)

Thus, if we are to endure the cross despising the shame, and share in His victory, we must have the experience of entire sanctification, and spend time in prayer and the reading of His word.
