

QUARTERLY MEETING.

The 28th session of the Quarterly Meeting convened with the church at Port Maitland, May 30 to June 3. On Wednesday evening Rev. H. C. Mullen brought to us the first message of the Quarterly. Text found in Acts 11-24: "For he was a good man, and full of the Holy Ghost and of faith: and much people was added unto the Lord."

Character sketch of Barnabas: First he was good. Goodness makes us humble and gentle, it is in the reach of us all. Salvation makes us good. He did not only have the Holy Ghost, but he was full of the Holy Ghost. If he was full of the Holy Ghost he was empty of carnality. If he was a man full of faith, he was a victorious man. A man full of faith is dependable.

On Thursday evening the message was brought by Rev. H. C. Mullen. Text found in Romans 9:30. Theme, "Why some fail to find God's righteousness." The reasons that caused the Israelites to fail is the cause of some failing today. Some do not seek Him because it interferes with their worldly prospects. Some seek in the wrong way—they do not seek by faith. Some do not submit themselves to God's righteousness. When we submit He will do something for us.

On Friday evening the message was brought by Rev. F. A. Dunlop. Text found in Ephesians 4:11: "And he gave some, apostles, and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some pastors and teachers."
