Without the Holy Spirit we are useless, helpless, hopeless, powerless and fruitless. Without Him we can do nothing, and with Him we can do all things. In a word He is our All in all. Praise His Holy, adorable, and precious name! Many people know the Holy Spirit in a theoretical way, but not in a practical way. One ounce of practise is better than one ton of theory. The Holy Spirit is waiting patiently for yielded lives and clean hearts in order to do His work. If He can get free and unfettered use of personality, then He can do a mighty work. The Spirit is as dependent upon us as we are upon Him. He is making stupendous efforts to save precious souls through lives that are entirely yielded. We need the Holy Spirit, and He needs us, therefore we should surrender our vessel that it might be filled to overflowing. It is our overflow that reaches, blesses, and rescues others. If we fail to overflow, we fail in our mission, we fail in our duty, we fail our Saviour, and we fail precious souls.

the Spirit, believers receive no help, conviction is absent, every exercise of the service is lifeless, the Gospel becomes unattractive, and dryness and deadness becomes manifestly evident. As a result of this, unrest makes its appearance, complaints begin to flow, discord strikes its jarring note, dissatisfaction becomes evident, and the church instead of helping men to heaven, prepare them for hell. A church that possesses the Holy Spirit in all His fullness will have bright, helpful, uplifting and inspiring services. Through such services, her members will be kept alive, the truth will be brought to sinners, God's name will be glorified, the saints will be edified, church membership will increase and the work of God will prosper. If churches and people would obey God and walk in the light, He would send the Holy Spirit in fulfilment of His promise.

When the gospel is preached without the accompaniment of the Holy Spirit it becomes offensive, and drives souls from the Saviour. When it is preached with the Holy Spirit sent down from heaven, it disturbs the conscience, arrests the mind, grips the heart, awakens all the faculties of the soul, arouses souls to their need of saving grace, makes Christ attractive, and none can evade its magnetic power. The gospel is nothing without the Holy Spirit preaching it, as they are inseparable. The presence of the Holy Spirit in the church will make her efficient in her commission, keep her active, and minister to every needy heart.
