Dear Highway Readers:

In our last Bible study we were considering the number four in connection with the "living creatures" of Rev. 4., R. V. and Ezek. 2:10. We had finished speaking briefly of the face like a lion, the one like a man, and had begun with that of an ox (ready for service or for sacrifice.) One of the best illustrations of the spirit here represented is the Apostle Paul, where he says, practically, I have served, not counting my life dear unto myself, and now am awaiting sacrifice. Listen while he speaks, "I have finished my course. I am ready to be offered." (2 Tim. 4: 6-8.). All through his ministry, the apostle Peter, laboured under the shadow of the cross upon which he was finally crucified, as he had been shown by our Lord. Read 2 Pet. 1:14 and Jno. 21:18,19. All that company of "caught-away-

ones" had the face of an ox, (Ezek. 1:10, with Rev. 12:5, and verse 11) and "loved not their lives unto the death." They are the saints most precious to God: His "jewels," whom He spares from passing through the coming "great tribulation." Read Mal. 3:16, 17, 18 with Rev. 3:10. They are among the favoured overcomers who have learned the secret of true service keepeth my works"), and are to sit with Christ in His throne, during the glorious Millenium, and with Him rule the nation. Read carefully Rev. 2: 26-28. Even Malachi foresaw this glory of the rapture and the returning to rule and "discern between the righteous and the wicked. . ." Paul says, "know ye not that the saints shall judge the world? and (even) angels?" (1 Cor. 6: 2, 3.)

The face we have not mentioned is that of an eagle (Ez. 1:10) which recalls to our mind the mounting "up with wings as eagles", Is. 40: 31. Also the words of Is. 57:15, where the high and lofty One speaks thus, "I dwell in the high and holy place with" a certain type of redeemed humanity. The same thought is brought out in Ps. 24: 3, 4, "Who shall ascend in to the hill of the Lord?" When we look at the mountain-peak experiences of scriptures, we find man responding to the invitation of God to meet with Him. We recall the rainbow-covenant with Noah, (Gen. 8.) upon the "mountains of Ararat." When God spake to Abraham from the open heavens, confirming, by an oath, His wonderful covenant, (Gen. 17 and ch. 22) the setting is "one of the mountains which I will tell thee of, in the land of Moriah." Mount Sinia was the pivot of Old Testament revelation and the climax of the life of Moses. There God descended in fire, wrote His law on tables of stone and showed Moses His glory.

An upper room was chosen for the outpouring of the antitype of Sinia, when the Divine law was written on human hearts. (Acts. 1:13 and Heb. 10:16) Elijah, whose name signifies "The Lord He is God," reached the height of his unique career on Mt. Carmel, where God met him in mighty manifestation of glory and power.

We recall "the holy mount" where Christ showed His power and coming" (2 Pet. 1:16-18) glory in His own person, bringing the translated Elijah of Carmel and the resurrected Moses of Sinia (Jude 9) to show what we shall be like when Jesus comes to catch away His waiting bride. She is to "meet Him in the air," having learned the secret of mounting "up with wings as eagles" by her mountain-top-experiences, when she beheld His glory ,and having been thus changed (2 Cor. 3:18) into the same image, is now like Him (1 Jno. 2:28, 3:1-3 and 4:17) and unashamed at His appearing. The marriage supper awaits them, and I suppose, presentations to the Father, (Rev. 3:5) the angels and to Himself "with exceeding great joy." (Jude 24.) But they are soon to return to earth (Rev. 19 to end the reign of the man of sin, and usher in the glorious millenium where they shall sit upon thrones and reign with Christ. (2 Thes. 2:8)

But even this is not all. Better things remain to be anticipated. This time it is "a great and high mountain" where we are shown the final consummation of God's plan for His faithful people. The milennium has come and gone, followed by the "great white throne," (Rev. 20:11) and the final separation of the human race into two companies. The one has gone to the "lake of fire," the "second death," while the other company shall "see His face; and His name shall be in their foreheads," "and they shall reign forever and ever."—Rev. 22-24.
