

## Young People's Column

Fredericton, N. B., March 16, 1932.

Dear Brother Trafton:

We would like to send in a report from the young people's branch of our work in Fredericton.

About two months ago we re-organized our young people's societies, now having one society called "The Reformed Baptist Berean Band".

We also drew up a set of bye-laws, as follows:

"Our aim shall be 'The Advancement of Christ's Kingdom'.

"Membership shall be of two classes—1st, Active Membership, which shall be open to all Christians, and include the right to vote and hold office. 2nd, Associate Membership, which shall be open to all those interested.

"The officers shall consist of a President, 1st Vice-President, 2nd Vice-President, Secretary-Treasurer, and Organist, with the Pastor as Advisor.

"Our slogan shall be, 'Christ for the Young People, and the Young People for Christ'.

"Meetings shall be held on Tuesday and Friday evenings of each week insofar as possible, at 7:30 o'clock. The place for these services shall be the church. Other meetings may be held for the benefit of sick and shut-in ones, as the Lord may lead.

"Our social and recreational programme shall be arranged for by appointed committees, and shall not be held in the church building.

"The matter of the use and raising of funds is to be decided upon in consultation with the Church.

"These bye-laws may be revised or added to in the future as may be deemed advisable".

Our bye-laws were brought before the Church and approved before being finally adopted.

Our services continue as usual, having a Prayer and Praise Service on Tuesday evening, led by one of the young people, and Bible Study Class on Friday evening of each week.

At our Bible Study Class we are given a set of questions for study during the week, the answers being announced the following Friday evening. Our pastor gives us a short but helpful talk, usually choosing one of the questions for his topic. We also enjoy musical numbers and readings, which add to the interest of the meetings.

These services are well attended, and the interest good. We feel encouraged to go on in His service.
