Wednesday night, June 1st, being the first evening of the meetings, was given to a discussion or talks on Sunday School work calling it our Sunday School Convention. Brother G. Symonds, (secretary), will probably report.

Thursday night, June 2nd, Prayer by Rev. H. E. Mullen. Song by Mr. and Mrs. George Landers. Lesson for the evening, Ephesians 5, text 16th verse, "Redeeming The Time For the Days are Evil". Preaching by Bro. Percy Green. His address was along lines of making the best use of our time. Getting ready to meet our Lord, we owe it to others to redeem our Time. Meeting closed with a good season of prayer.
