### AN URGENT APPEAL

We have lately had a letter from Helen Sterritt, saying that they have lost their last horse from horse sickness. So they are very much handicapped now in their work in travelling over the country. She is asking for funds to buy another horse or two and we will have to respond and send them enough to replace their loss, so the good work may go on. I know that many of our people are doing wonderfully well in giving to the support of our work in Africa as well as the homeland. I know of some folk in this section of the province, where we are the hardest hit by the depression, because we are in the potato farming section, and the price of potatoes as well as all other farm produce has gone flat. Here are some of the prices that they get: Potatoes 10c to 25c per bbl., with heavy fertilizer bills to pay on last year's crop; butter 10c to 12c per lb. while the weather was cool but now the dealers cannot handle it at all; eggs 8c to 10c per dozen. And yet I say I know some folk who live in humble homes without many of what we call modern conveniences, where the women not only do their work in the house for a good sized family, but also go out and do a good deal of outside work, because they are not able to hire a man. And they are making the last year's hat and dress and coat do for this year. But they are keeping up their contributions to the Lord's work, both in the foreign and home lands which amounts to hundreds of dollars yearly.

Beloved this comes nearer to sacrifice than anything that I know of, and ought to be, and I hope it will be an inspiration to others who read these lines, to give much more to the Lord's work in the future.
