We have found the fall a very busy one, getting settled, making some repairs on the buildings, and getting acquainted with the field in general. We have done a great deal of calling, which we find very profitable to the work. We spent one week, the 1st of October, out at Gordonsville, calling every day, and had service every night. God blessed us, and conviction was on each service, but no one responded. The ladies served a delicious lunch after which Deacon Ziba Orser spoke a few words of welcome which we tried to respond to, and Brother Willie Ride-out offered prayer.

There are some of the best folk on earth on the Hartland circuit. We love them all, and hope to be made a real blessing to them. They have fond remembrances of their former pastor, yet are showing us every courtesy possible, and we feel God will bless us as we

work together in the interest of His kingdom.

Two souls have found the Lord under our ministry, and there have been several requests for prayer, just recently. Last Sunday we had our first baptism, two candidates followed their Lord in this way. A number are talking of uniting with the Church at Lower Brighton.
