## A MOVE TOWARD ROME

Nothing speaks more certainly of the trend of that section of the Anglican Church in Great Britain known as the Oxford Movement (not the Oxford Group Movement) toward Roman Catholicism, as the renewed and increased interest of the Vatican. This is displayed in the reply of Pope Pius XI. to the letter from the Archbishop of Canterbury, in which he thanks him "for intimating his desire to associate himself with the celebration of the jubilee of Christ—the nineteen hundredth anniversary of the Passion," and also, according to The New York Times, to the hope that is said to be freely expressed in Vatican circles "that the union of the Anglican and Roman Churches will not be long delayed. It is added on the highest authority that envoys of the Holy See are now in England doing their utmost to achieve this aim, and that the announcement of a conversion of considerable importance may be expected shortly."—Alliance Weekly.
