If these recommendations are accepted by our District S. S. Convention, we would advise that the District Sunday School Convention submit them to the Annual S. S. Convention of the Alliance for their consideration and approval to be used by the Sunday Schools of the Reformed Baptist Denomination as a whole. Resolved this Section be adopted and recommended with corrections as above.
