## Interesting Items

#### AMERICA'S CRIME BILL

The National Council, formed in Washington, D. C., on July 4, by citizens seeking to arouse the public to the menace of organized crime, reports that crime is costing the nation \$13,000,000,-000 annually; that an average of 12,000 persons are murdered in the United States every year; 3,000 are kidnapped; 100,000 assaulted; 50,000 robbed; 40,000 homes and other places burglarized, and more than \$100,000,000 lost through incendiary fires. The Council adds the information that the center of the problem lies in the alliance of corrupt judges, crooked politicians, grafting police officers, and unprincipled lawyers. The usual successful criminal keeps an attorney on a yearly fee, whose business is to keep his client out of jail, through "sympathetic" judges, on writs of habeas corpus. It is estimated that 400,-000 people in our country are making their living from crime today.—Alliance Weekly.

#### INFANTICIDE'S TOLL

The New York Times is authority for the statement that in the streets of Shanghai and in the waters around the city there were found last year the bodies of nearly 34,000 infants, most of them the victims of infanticide. One of China's ancient customs still flourishes today in this, its most modernized city.

Shanghai is the leading industrial center of the country. The factory system here rests in large measure on women and child workers, as it has done everywhere in its early stages. The terrific pressure of over-population brings it to pass that in Shanghai every year twice as many infants are cast out to perish as there are deaths of all ages and all kinds in New York City, proportionate to the population.—Selected.

## MILLIONS STARVE IN RUSSIA

It is certain that 5,000,000 persons in Russia have perished from starvation, Whiting Williams, investigator and lecturer, told the Chamber of Commerce in Cleveland, October 10, reporting a recent trip to the Soviet and to Germany.

"I myself stepped over a score of children and adults who were dying and who bore all the signs of starvation," he said. "Engineers I consulted found Russian officers discussing not the actuality of starvation, but whether it was 10,000,000 or 15,000,000 who had so perished. There are numerous reports of cannibalism.

"However, I find Russian workers and peasants are in a colossal campaign of passive resistance, doing as little as they can get away with, and I believe that campaign will win."—Evangelical Messenger.

## SAYS EVOLUTION THEORY IS DEAD

Speaking as guest preacher at the Marble Collegiate Church on a recent Sunday morning, Dr. David DeForest Burrell of the First Presbyterian Church of Williamsport, Pennsylvania, stated that the theory of evolution had suffered a more complete collapse than is generally realized. He said that the president of the British Academy of Sciences had recently asserted that we had come to the end of the evolutionary theory and that the only alternative was that of creation. Dr. Burrell stressed particularly the fact that Christian philosophy does not identify the universe with God. It is interesting to note how much many of our preachers have been influenced by the writings of Jeans and Eddington.—Selected.
