## MISSIONARY CORRESPONDENCE

To the Kings Highway,

To our Highway Friends Known and Unknown in the Homeland, Greetings.

We might say, To our Friends and acquaintances in Canada and United States, but we betieve that contrary to the common rule, we have more friends than we have acquaintances, for those who are friends to this work, whether they know us or not, are our friends. By the time this letter reaches you another year will have come to its close. We trust that the New Year will be one of blessing and comfort to all our friends. The year which has past has been a year of victory in this work. We have had our difficulties and disappointments, our trials and sorrows but through it all the Lord has sustained us. We have seen much to encourage us in the Lord. We thank God for a united group of Workers, white and black, for the progress made through the year. We had hoped for greater, nevertheless there has been progress made, and we believe that the spirit of revival is on now. We have had at least five who a year ago were raw heathen, die in the faith during this year. We are glad that the gospel reached them before it was too late.

A few have gone from us, some have fallent by the way, yet on the whole the work is encouraging. Some of our enemies are being defeated, who have set themselves against this work, but circumstances have changed and their strength is being broken. The justice of our cause is being demonstrated as well as the purity of the standards of our church, and these who have opposed Holiness are being swept aside. Those who have been a menace to this work we believe will soon be forced to remove from this district, and we believe that the deceived and deluded people who have followed these teachers will again return to this fold.

Our Summer rains have come, most of the rivers are in flood now and have been for the last few weeks and the country never looked better since I came here. We are having the usual number of hungry and naked coming to us for food and clothing, but in as much as the rains have come early this year their plight will not be as bad as it has been for the past three years for which we are thankful.

We have seven schools going and they have been doing well and are a real asset to the Work, but unless funds come from somewhere I shall be unable to keep the most of these open after this term. Six of these schools we have been forced to support almost entirely, but can do this no longer without help. Is there not some one in the Homeland who will be interested in this branch of the Work? A small school can be supported by sixty dollars per year above what the Natives are able to do. School work has been blessed of the Lord. We have many, some of our best, with us today because a teacher was sent to their district. The heathen parents first gave their children to the school, then to the Church, and in many cases, followed, giving themselves as well and have been saved. One of our best workers in the entire Work is our's today because Dr. Sanders sent a teacher into his district. Not only is he with us, but one of the most encouraging churches through his efforts. Thus you may see a little of the value of a school.

Our attendance in the mid-week service is exceptionally good for summer, in fact I believe that the attendance has been better at our Wed-esday Class all this year than any year since I came here. Our Sunday School is coming up wonderfully, there were eighty present last Sun-

day. Because of the Auto we have been able to visit the outposts more often and take more evangelists with us, because we could put in a good meeting by an absence of a day or two from their outpost, and many of these were mid-week meetings. Thus they were enabled to give a helping hand to needy stations, get acquainted themselves with the new station, and yet not neglect their own work. Eternity alone will reveal what the Auto has meant and does mean to this work.

Once again we thank you for all your support of the past and crave your continued support for the future both in prayer and in finance. We rejoice with you in the Homeland in all your victories of the past year. We are especially grateful to God for the young men who are entering the field and answering the call to the ministry, and pray that God may bless them while they are preparing for this work, giving them the grace to pay the price of a thorough training for this work. We pray that the evangelistic efforts of this coming season may be a blessed success. We rejoice very much that you are having Sister Manning with you in the Eastern Provinces. God has wonderfully used her through the New England States. Her experience as a pastor and song leader and evangelist are well known. She has been used of God to bring many souls into the Kingdom. May her efforts be blessed again to the salvation of many more souls in Canada.
