Meeting adjourned having been rather lengthy but profitable.

Sunday morning's love feast was lead by Bernard Tatton.

At eleven o'clock N. J. Sanders was the preacher, using for a text Isaiah 61:1-2.

The Sunday School followed directly after the preaching service. We feel we had a profitable time during this period.

Sunday afternoon, Bro. Bennett Cochrane delivered a wonderful sermon from Jno. 7:38.

Sunday evening Bro. Percy Green, of Wood Island, preached a stirring and effective sermon from Acts 27. Four seekers were to the altar at the close of the service, three for Salvation, and one for Sanctification. All claimed victory. Later, some of those who got through to victory said they never had such an experience as they now had received. One other soul sought and claimed sanctification after the Saturday evening service.

We were glad to see some folk from the church at Beals, Me., to the Quarterly.
