Dear Highway Friends:

I am giving you just a short sketch of the three months work done for the British and Foreign Bible Society. As many of you know, I had charge of the Bible stand at Beulah Camp Meeting from June 26th until July 9th. After that I had charge of the Bible stand at a Bible Conference meeting at the Alliance Tabernacle, Saint John, N. B., for five days. After that I travelled by car in Charlotte Co. and lower part of York Co., making thorough house to house calls, making in all 2,735 calls or visits, selling 564 Bibles, 356 Testaments, and 1700 portions of scriptures, also giving free 21 Bibles, 3 Testaments, 152 gospels, making a total distribution of 2796 pieces of scripture, amounting to \$547.20 in all.

I distributed more Bibles this year than any previous year. I called at and sold scriptures at gas stations, construction camps, sport camps as well as at private homes. I found 12 families this year without Bibles or any portion of one, and not able to buy. To each of these families I left a Bible. I also gave one Bible in the Polish language, one in the Chinese, two in Slovak, one in Russian. These for-

eigners were young men and could not read our language, and took great interest in the Bibles given them, especially the two Slovak lads. The lady with whom they boarded told me later that they not only read them, but they also would copy off portions and send to their folk in their home land. One of these Slovake lads shortly after I had given him the Bible, cut his wrist very badly and the first thing he asked for at the hospital was the BOOK which the Bible man gave him, and he read it much while laid up. "My word shall not return void," saith the Scriptures. I could tell of many many other instances of interest if space would permit. Colporteur work, while it has its trials and testing, is truly a great work, owned and blessed of God. Truly the "fields are white to the harvest," and the labourers are few. The British and Foreign Bible Society is doing a great work and is worthy of the support of all our church, and all Christian people.
