## EDITORIAL

### OUR WONDERFUL SAVIOUR

"His Name shall be called Wonderful."—Isaiah 9-6.

Someone has called the book of the prophet Isaiah, "The gospel of the old testament," because the inspired writer wrote so much about Jesus. He prophesied of his birth, his sufferings, death and his work. His prophesies concerning our Lord have been so perfectly fulfilled that one might think they were written after the gospel dispensation had been ushered in instead of many years before. At this season of the year our minds turn again to Isaiah's prophesy of the birth of Jesus. He wrote, "Behold a virgin shall conceive and bear a son," and again, "Unto us a child is born, unto us a son is given." The following names or particulars given of him: Wonderful, Counsellor, The Mighty God, The Everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace, are not to be understood as descriptive of His name alone but of his glorious nature and qualities. It was very fitting that the prophet should call him Wonderful, for He is wonderful in His incarnation, His birth, His patient sufferings, and death—Wonderful in His triumphant resurrection and ascension to become our Mediator, our high priest by which we draw nigh unto God, Wonderful in His power to save men from sin, "For He is able to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by Him." He has sanctified and made sacred the birth of all children by his own coming into the world that way. There seems to be something sacred about every newborn child. Who can look upon one of these innocent, helpless little creatures, and yet with such great possibilities before him without wonder and admiration; especially the parents of the newborn babies can see something in them to wonder at even when some others do not, and we say that is because it is their child. Well! that might be one reason that the child born in the manger at Bethlehem so long ago is so wonderful to us all who know Him. It is because He is our child, and not Marys' alone. Did not the prophet say "Unto us a child is born?" So we all have, or may have Him for ours. Hence the reason we rejoice again and again at this season of the year and try to celebrate the birth of our Wonderful Saviour! Our Lord differs from a mere man in many respects, but especially in this. The better we know Him, the more we see in Him that excites our wonder and admiration. This is not always true with our knowledge of men. We are often favorably impressed with men at our first acquaintance with them; but as we

come to know them better we are often greatly disappointed. Jesus is not a disappointment, and will become more wonderful to us as the ages pass, even to all eternity. I wonder more and more at His mercy in making such a sacrifice to save poor, unworthy sinners such as I.
