## THE UNSHRINKABLES!

I bought a garment in Kohe the other day, and when I asked the assistant in the shop if it would shrink in the washing, he looked at me, and then with a tone of voice full of certainty, said, "No. it won't shrink; we have washed it." Splendid for the assistant! What he really wanted me to know was, that before the garment had been exposed for sale, his firm had put the material through a certain process called "washing" which had eliminated the dangers of shrinkage. I have thought since that it would be a great thing for the kingdom of God if the Lord Iesus could say of us all, "They won't shrink: I have washed them"?

In the Prayer Book version of Psalm 112, where the "good man" is revealed, we are told in verse 8 that. "His heart is established, and will not shrink." In the A. V., it is "he shall not be afraid." To find the words "Shrink" and 'afraid" joined together in the two versions is rather suggestive and probably shows that the reason why some people shrink and also shirk -is because they are afraid. There are two meanings to this word "shrink" and we must have a look at them here. The first one is "to reduce" or "to be reduced in dimensions"; "to tend" or "to curl". The other meaning is "to withdraw" or "to retire as from danger": "to decline action from fear"; "to recoil or retire" The "good man" has certainly something to be rhankful for if he has an experience that keeps him clear of that list.

Are we now face to face with the reason why so few regular dare-devils are striking out for the "habitations of cruelty" on the Mission Field to unfurl Christ's banner there? Has somebody had a "shrinking fit", and their love for God and the souls of the lost has been so "reduced" that they have been compelled "to withdraw and "to decline action" against the hosts of darkness? How terribly sad! Perhaps like a sheet of beautiful parchment they have been placed before the hot fire of gossip and opposition, and they have "curled" and "shrunk". God help us. Or, it may be that the dear little things, like a piece of nice soft flannel, have been dropped in boiling water somewhere, and they have been "reduced in their dimensions". It is said that when some people reach old age their limbs begin to shrink. and someone has actually written about "the shrunken limbs of old age." Well, well, the cat is out of the bag at last, and we can see now that the reason why the battle for God and souls among the heathen is being avoided, is because there are too many dear, nice, old, young people in the Churches and Mission Halls at home. like so many shrunken blankets (and wet, too, probably)! Too many "retired" ones!

Can anybody imagine Nehemiah "curling up", "withdrawing" or "retiring", when he was intimidated, mocked, and laughed at by his crafty foes? No, never! He wasn't one of the curling up kind! What a glorious testimony God would have lost in Babylon if the three Hebrew boys had allowed the king "to reduce" their sense of honour and their Faith in God! It would have been terrible, but brave souls that they were, they could not "bend"; they could not "reduce" to meet the empire's wishes. Hallelujah. Daniel was another soul who could not "reduce" even when he got into boiling water for praying too much! Did he "decline" to go forward when he made an excursion to the lion's den? No, indeed not! There was no shrinking in his make-up. Glory to God. Just think of the old warrior Paul allowing the devil, or the world, or anything for that matter, to "reduce" his love pasion for the evangelisation of the great heathen world! Picture him acting the "Weary Willie" and "withdrawing" from the front tren ches! Look at him retiring from the battle because it is so dangerous; declining to pull souls out of the devil's hot fire because he is afraid! You can't imagine anything of the kind happening in the life of such a hero! He—like others who have come under the power of the Blood and the power of the Holy Ghost—would not allow himself to shrink if he had to live in boiling water, and would not curl up even if he had to sit on top of the devil's stove all day. Hats off to this type of unreducible, fearless, unshrinkable and unshrinking warrior! At the same time, let us fall into line.

Some people allow their faith to "shrink", their passion for world-evangelisation "to be reduced", their hearts "to recoil", their prayers "to withdraw", and their liberality "to retire" because of gossip, opposition, and persecution. May the Lord God give us all the "heart that will not shrink, though pressed by many a foe".
