EDITORIAL

OUR YOUNG PEOPLE AT BEULAH CAMP OF 1936

Four years ago at the annual meeting of our Alliance at Beulah Camp, there was born to the denomination an infant organization which was christened "The Young People's Association".

"Born, not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God", and having enjoyed throughout the brief period of its existence the nourishing and helpful support of both the ministry and laity, this child of faith has experienced a rapid and healthy development. Not least of the evidences of progress in this department of our work, has been the noticeable increase in the number of young people attending the campmeetings. Each year since the birth of the Association, and from this the local societies, more young people have been coming to Beulah and Riverside, until this year we were privileged to see at Beulah what many of the older people declared to be the largest company of youth ever in attendance. It was not a sightseeing, pleasure-seeking group, but a spiritual, consecrated band who were eager to contribute as they could to the success of the Camp, and receive such benefit as would tend to growth in spiritual life. Almost a perfect percentage of the young people at the Camp were regularly present at the young people's meeting held in the tabernacle at 4 o'clock each afternoon, and what blessing fell upon us as we reaffirmed our faith in the Lord Jesus and our love for the glorious experience and message of holiness! Every service was beautifully owned of God, and there were times when the Spirit anointed both speaker and listeners in a manner that lifted us into the heavenly places in Christ Jesus. Praise the Lord! This fact is very evident—our young people are deeply devoted to the cause of full salvation, and they desire nothing more than that they may be worthy to assist in the performing of the task for which we, as a denomination were brought into being, that of "spreading scriptural holiness over these lands."

With the money contributed by the various societies to the General and Self-Denial Funds, we were able, by contributing to funds which support different departments of our denominational work both at home and in Africa, to enjoy the glad privilege of sharing the financial burdens which our people so nobly bear.

The fellowship of the saints, the wonderful messages from the Word by Dr. Butler, the good reports of last year's work, and the individual blessings that we received from Beulah Campmeeting of 1936, constrain us to breathe fervent prayers of thanksgiving to our God for these benefits, and face the new church year with a clearer vision, a deeper love, and a brighter hope.

For the benefit of all our young people, and especially those who were unable to attend Beulah, we give this brief report and also print in detail the financial standing of the Association.

Let us face the future with a purpose that this year shall be the greatest in spiritual life that we have ever known.

Twenty-five societies have reported, showing a total membership of 508, an increase of 50 over last year.

There are some Societies whose special activities are worthy of mention. Three, namely Perth, Belvidere, and Jonesport, have assisted financially in redecorating the interior of their respective churches, while other societies have contributed to the defraying of church expenses. The Amherst Society has taken advantage of the opportunity of holding a monthly service in the County jail. These activities, we feel, are highly commendable.

The General Fund treasurer and the Secretary-treasurer of the Self-Denial Fund both presented good reports.

Most of the societies report their spiritual condition as being good, and it is very gratifying to note the number of young people present at Beulah, professing and possessing the experience of full salvation.

We praise the Lord for His blessing upon us during the past year and face the future with renewed hopes.
