In Miss Watson's General Fund report for 1935-1936, appearing in the July 31st issue of the Highway, you will note that the Young Peoples Association pledged the sum of twenty-five dollars to the "Bullock Fund."

As you may already know, this fund was originated last year in memory of the Bullock family, and its receipts are of be used to keep the buildings and grounds at Beulah in repair.

The money pledged by the young people was to the support of the following plan:
