These are the words of Jesus to His servant John who was imprisoned on the isle of Patmos "for the word of God and the testimony of Jesus Christ." He gives the description of the same in the preceding verse of this chapter and says, "When I saw Him I fell at His feet as dead" because he was so overwhelmed with the glorious vision, and he states, "He laid His right hand upon me saying unto me, 'Fear not I am the first and the last' and 'I am He that liveth and was dead and behold I am alive forever more.'"

The resurrection of Jesus was the greatest fact of history. It was at the time of the passover feast and it is believed that over a million people were at Jerusalem at the time of His crucifixion. A multitude saw Him die. He had told the people previous to this time that He must go to Jerusalem and suffer many things and be put to death but that He would rise again the third day; and the fulfillment of this promise demonstrated His power over death for He had visited the dark abode of death and He came back again declaring: "I am He that liveth and have the keys of hell and of death." He has robbed death of its sting and the grave of its victory and has delivered them who "through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to bondage." His resurrection is the proof of our resurrection. The apostle Paul said, "Now is the Christ risen from the dead and become the first fruits of them that slept" and again "Because He lives we shall live also."

His resurrection is also the manifestation of His power over sin. The apostle in his letter to the Hebrews says, "Wherefore He is able to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by Him, because He ever liveth to make intercession for them."
