Dear Friends:

The following are a few items out of a letter from Grace, written Jan. 10th. Only one month ago—very fast travelling.

"Wednesday, Jan. 5th, I was called out of class (mid-week prayer meeting) and about ten minutes later a crashing, sizzling bolt of lightning struck the church, and eight or nine people. Jostina (Aloni's wife) died in Faith's and my arms, outside of the church, never regaining consciousness. Jessina came to, being supported by Charles. Another was benumbed and is slowly recovering from the shock, was taken home Friday, better, able to walk to the car with a little help. A burn, size of a pea on her leg. Jessina has been here ever since, terribly burned. But burns not as painful as one would think, clean and healing well. Just a little more voltage through her and she would have gone too. Oh! How sweet Jessina is! Befat sat against Jessina, Jessina next to Jostina but was fleeing away from them. Burned size of a 50 cent piece on hip. Received a shock but no terror nor fear, not affected like I feared she would be with her weak heart. But she has been better since."

This is three times bolts of lightning have struck near buildings at Hartland. This is the first time any one was killed.

Jostina is one of our first converts. She was a young woman, lately married when Dr. Sanders and I first came to Hartland and, though not becoming a Christian that first year, she was interested and soon came desiring to be taught to read. Several years afterwards she became one of our faithful Bible women. These three women injured have been great workers for God. Befat used to go across Pivaan river no matter what the weather, and hold meetings with distant kraals. I remember one Sunday it rained hard and was cold. About dusk Befat came to the kitchen drenched and almost numb with the chill. Making her a good cup of ginger tea, I made her warm herself by the fire. How grateful she was and when she was leaving she asked me to give her some of that good medicine to have at home so she could get warmed by it another time. She is the mother

of the young woman Lipina who died in November.

Jessina has been wonderfully used of God too, and a marvellous woman of prayer. I remember years ago she was sent for to go at a distance to pray with some sick person. Just as she was about ready to go visit, another call came. Two cases at the same time. What was she to do? She asked God for directions. To her mind came the words in Acts where handkerchiefs and aprons were sent to sick ones by one of the Apostles, and the sick recovered, so she took a waist of hers and sent it by the hand of the messenger, saying, "I cannot go now but you take this and spread it over the sick, and I will come tomorrow." If I remember, both these recovered in answer to her prayers.

Continue to pray for these children of God, our brothers and sisters across the sea, and let us help all we can.
