YOUNG PEOPLE'S CONVENTION, 1938

The sixth annual convention of the Young People's Association was held the last Saturday afternoon of Beulah Camp Meeting, with a good attendance. The usual high quality of inspiration and encouragement characterized the service.

Our new president, Rev. Gordon Symonds, pledged the loyal support of the Association in the work of the church.

Following the opening devotional exercises, the Corresponding Secretary brought his report, which contained much to invoke thanksgiving regarding the work of our young people during the past year. Our secretary voiced the gratitude and commendation of the Association toward the good work of our retiring president, Rev. G. A. DeLong. Expressions of appreciation was also spoken concerning the Bible lessons appearing in the Highway, and the good work of Brother Dunlop in preparing the same. With many societies still unreported, the membership totalled three hundred and forty-six. The sum of two hundred and fifty dollars and sixty-one cents was contributed by our young people during the year for the support and advancement of the work of God. If all reports had been received, doubtless the membership would have shown an increase over last year.

Over one hundred persons in the convention meeting pledged themselves to our Self Denial Fund, in order that they might assist in the full support of Grace Sanders in Africa. Our young people desired to undertake this task, that they might share in the bearing of burdens, and the foreign mission board gave its ready consent to the request. We were glad to welcome Mr. Claude Vipond, president of the Wesleyan Young People's Conference of Canada, to our annual meeting, and heartily enjoyed a brief address by him.

The convention preacher, Rev. H. E. Mullen, was well chosen. From the text, I. Peter 5:8, he emphasized the need of sobriety, vigilance, and loyalty to God in opposing our adversary, the devil, who is unceasingly trying to find occasion to accuse us falsely, or like the roaring lion, intimidate us. Our brother exhorted us to stand firm in the strength of the God of all peace, that instead of being devoured by our enemy, we may be able to resist and put him to flight. This fine message was received with great appreciation, and the seal of God was upon the truth.

A splendid variety of special music was rendered by our young people. The Briggs sisters, Glenna (Mrs. Homer Smith), Reta and Hazel, sang a beautiful trio. A male quartette composed of Robert Clifford, Wilbur Mullen, Norman Sanders and Donald Mitton, joined in vocal and spiritual harmony in the appropriate song, "I Want My Life to Count for Jesus." Rev. Norman Trafton contributed to the musical part of the convention, singing a solo in the spirit. The special songs rendered by these vocalists were of the best type and added much to the meeting.

Rev. H. S. Mullen, our honorary president elected this year, expressed his appreciation of that office, and brought this sixth convention of our Young People's Association to a close with a prayer of benediction.
