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"OVERCOMES THROUGH CHRIST"

Paul in the first verse of the 12th chapter of Romans says: "I beseech you, brethren, by the mercies of God, that ye present your bodies a living sacrifice, holy, acceptable unto God which is your reasonable service." Throughout the same chapter he continues to exhort them concerning how to keep in the Christian way. In the last verse he sums it up in this: "Be not overcome of evil, but overcome evil with good." It is impossible for an individual to overcome evil with good unless he has presented himself a living sacrifice to God, which means that we are wholly yielded to him, our future and ambitions, our will, our abilities, our very all given to the Master. All Christians will realize before they have been following Christ very long that there are evils to overcome, and if we do not overcome them, they will surely overcome us, resulting in our being defeated by the enemy of our souls.

We will mention some of the different forms of evil that we must overcome:

First: TEMPTATION. In this Christ was an overcomer. His encounter with the devil in the wilderness is recorded in Matt. 4. Each suggestion of the enemy was defeated, for Christ met him with the sword of the Spirit, which is the Word of God, saying, "It is written." The enemy always flees in defeat when we meet him with God's Word, which has stood the test of the ages. Heb. 2:18 says: "For in that He Himself hath suffered being tempted, He is able to succour them that are tempted."

Secondly: We must overcome DISCOUR-AGEMENT. It is the "most used" of all the devil's implements. With it he has wrecked many souls. If we look for things to discourage, we will surely find them, but if we are trusting God we can see things to encourage in the darkest times. God realized Joshua's need of encouragement when he was about to take Moses' place in leading the children of Israel, and three times He exhorted him to be strong and of good courage. Then after hearing from God, Joshua encouraged the people, who in turn enocuraged him. One of the greatest needs of Christian people in these days, is to be strong and of good courage, and to encourage one another.

Thirdly: We must overcome MISUNDER-STANDING. Much trouble and many heart aches are caused through misunderstanding. Christ was misunderstood by the majority, and we shall be misunderstood by the world. Peter, in his first epistle, ch. 4:2-4, exhorts the Christian that he should no longer live the rest of his time in the flesh to the lusts of men, but to the will of God. Speaking of the Gentiles, he continues, "wherein they think it strange that ye run not with them to the same excess of riot, speaking evil of you.

Fourthly: We must overcome the WORLD. In John's gospel 16:33 comforting words of Jesus to his disciples are recorded: "These things have I spoken unto you that ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation but be of good cheer, I have overcome

the world." Then in his first epistle John writes: I have written unto you, fathers, because ye have known him that is from the beginning. I have written unto you young men because ye are strong, and the Word of God abideth in you, and ye have overcome the wicked one. Love not the world, neither the things that are in the world. If any man love the world, the love of the Father is not in him. Again he declares: "Whosoever is born of God overcometh the world, and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith. Who is he that overcometh the world, but he that believeth that Jesus is the son of God? Thank God, we can be overcomers through Jesus Christ! Paul exhorts us to OVERCOME EVIL WITH GOOD. This coincides with Christ's teaching and His example. In the book of Revelation it is written concerning the redeemed saints: "And they overcame him (the wicked one) by the blood of the Lamb and the word of their testimony, and they loved not their lives unto death." The blood of Christ has never lost its power! God has provided a salvation that is perfect in every detail, and cannot be improved upon. Best of all, it is for "whosoever will." The all-sufficient grace of God will enable us to overcome all evil, and be more than conquerors.

ARE YOU JOINING UP?

Seventy million young Americans and Canadians with no challenge to call them to high service and bring out the best that is in them. Seventeen million five hundred thousand of them never darken the door of Sunday school or sanctuary. What can be done to save our young?
