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EDITORIAL

A casual acquaintance with the work of God reveals that the greatest problem we are confronted with is not getting people to accept Christ, but rather persuading them to follow Him. Many there are who have come to the Christ of the Cross, but only a few, comparatively speaking, are willing to bear the Cross for Christ. They make a good start in the race, but become weary and fall out long before the goal is in view. They join in the battle, but, being unwilling to endure hardness, they retire before the victory is won. Many there are who start in the race, But with the light refuse to keep pace; Others accept it because it is new, But not very many expect to go through.

What is the cause of this great "falling away?" What the remedy for this deplorable loss?

A workable answer to these questions should enable us to retain in our ranks those who might otherwise become deserters, and help some to "run the race with patience," who would otherwise fall by the way. What is our need?

First: Greater depth of experience.

Jesus said that some who heard the Word received it gladly, but because they had no depth of earth they withered away as soon as the heat of trial began to reach them. The seed was received, and the germ of life within it was allowed to express itself producing a plant, but the day of fruit-bearing was never reached because of shallowness of soil. The reason many have such a brief existence in spiritual life, springing up suddenly, and withering away even more quickly, is very often because there was no real repentance for sin, no real praying through and by grace, through faith, undergoing that marvelous transformation that results when an individual becomes personally acquainted with the Lord Jesus. A little weeping, a little singing, and a little rejoicing, may indicate nothing more than ease of conscious or emotional ecstacy; we need to pray through until the Spirit beareth witness with our Spirit that we are born of God. Another need is: Greater purpose of heart. All the heroes of faith that have made heaven, have of necessity sometime in early days of fellowship with God developed a fixed determination to "go through." Joshua said, "Others may do as they will, go where they desire, but 'as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.'" David said: "O my God, my heart is fixed." Daniel "purposed in his heart that he would not defile himself . . ." Moses "refused to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter, choosing rather to suffer affliction with the people of God." Yes, and you and I must throw all the strength of will that we possess behind this spiritual enterprise if we wish to join those who have run and obtained. Finally, we need: Greater appreciation of the value of the prize we seek.
