THE FIFTH COLUMN

This awful fever has vitiated the atmosphere of worship and office—it has entered homes and plunged them into debt from which many will never recover in a lifetime. It has even entered the school life of our nation, so that children are affected by it.

This is an age of Dictators and one could almost wish that God would raise up a **Religious Dictator** of the Cromwellian type, who would sweep away many of the so-called pleasures which are ruining our people, and hold them to it, no matter how they howl, until they learn to appreciate Spiritual values, and it begins to dawn upon them that the things they thought they could never live without, have no further attraction for them.

This nation must repent or go under. Whatever the glories of the past, may we not try to make ourselves believe that somehow we are God's favourites, and that defeat is impossible.
