There are some great churches. The Nazarenes have six churches in and around Miami. First, and Central Churches are splendid structures with good congregations.

I heard W. J. Harney at Grace Nazarene Church Sunday morning, the 14th. He looks like an old man. He was a boy like myself 44 years ago in Asbury College. But the old man set the place on fire. We got to a religious service every night.

There are two good holiness missions nearby and revival services are being held in two Nazarene churches and a special Bible conference (Fundamental) in the First Presbyterian Church. We find that God has His people everywhere. If I were a sport I would find enjoyment at the movies, the horse and dog races, the fairs, and the beaches. Thank God the pull is towards God's people and the places where God is honored.

The boys have left for Boston. I shall remain here at least a week longer. I hope to go to St. Petersburg, then to DeLand for the holiness camp held there the middle of February. I spoke in the First Nazarene Church last night and enjoyed it. The glory holds and the fire burns.

word "abstain" is used here as in the text. And I doubt if these two provisions: the life and the blessing of sanctification, are, in and of themselves, sufficient to fully cover the case unless the splendid comment of Dr. Clarke is not practised. I have been in the Christian ministry for around a half century and I know many cases where ministers have yielded themselves to the lower nature and gone down to perdition. Some of them were holiness men of national reputation. Not long ago, in my home state a so-called holiness man killed his blind wife in order to marry his housekeeper. I have seen college presidents fall. Did this provision work? It did not seem to. Why? Because it did not have the human cooperation. Brethren, we are not yet in Paradise. We are in the enemy's land. None of us are out of gun-shot of the devil. Don't imagine yourself in a fool's paradise. Your enemy lurks on every side.
