GOD'S CHALLENGE TO HIS PEOPLE

"If my people who are called by my name shall humble themselves, and pray and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways. Then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sins, and heal their land.—II. Chro. 7:14.

The foregoing words were spoken by our Heavenly Father in the days of Solomon, Israel's king, at the time of the dedication of the temple, when God was pleased with His people and their king. In those days He also warned Israel of the evils that would befall them if they departed from their God, and sinned against him; He said I will shut up heaven that there be no rain, I will command the locusts to devour the land, or I will send pestilence among My people, and God kept His word, and did punish Israel in various ways when they sinned against Him: But He told them in the words of our text that their case would not be hopeless, for if they would accept His challenge He would have mercy, and again send deliverance and healing to their land.

WESLEY'S EXHORTATION

A BIG ONE

George H. Herbig, of Pasadena, California, a sophomore in the University of California at Los Angeles, by using certain new methods has proved that Ras Algethi, in the constellation of Hercules, is the largest star in the heavens, thus upsetting the present theory that the largest star is Antares in the constellation of Scorpia. He states that Ras Algethi is 690,000,000 miles in diameter, 800 times greater than the diameter of the sun. His calculations show that Mira's diameter is 395,000,000 miles, as the second largest in the heavens; Betelgeuse, the third, has a diameter between 230,000,000 and 360,000,000 miles, and the fourth, Antares, formerly supposed to be the greatest, has a diameter of 254,000,000.-United Presbyterian.
