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A REAL HOLY GHOST REVIVAL

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"TiThen they that gladly received the Word were re baptized: and the same day there were addeded unto them about three thousand souls." Acts ts 3:41.

Thins, in brief, is the numerical report of the first it Pentecostal revival. Soon after, five thousand d more were added to the church. If a report rt like this were sent to a modern-day holiness ss weekly it would deserve being placed withithin a "box" on the front page. We all believe in Holy Ghost revivals and we would like to see the results obtained at Pentecost. If www would have old-time Holy Ghost revivals with old-time results, we must get back to olold-time methods and means of revivals. Let it us study the first Pentecostal revival and see e what conditions were met, then apply the samene methods today. Perhaps we can obtain like e results.

1.1. The disciples were saved men. Their nammes were written in Heaven. They had beem with Jesus and learned of Him. They werre not of the world even as their Lord was not tof the world. They had been commissioned to preach and to cast out devils. Before a chumrch can save others, she must be saved hersrself. She must warm by the same fire with whicich she would warm others. A church that is lillike a refrigerator will never have a revival. It mmust get thawed out first. Better do away withth the "supper-room" and put in the "upperroomm" of prayer. You will never see a revival in yoyour church otherwise. Do away with the oystster stews and the ice cream suppers. Thesey are too dead and too cold anyway. Institutute something that has more fire and life thanan these things. "Judgment must begin at the le house of God." Let the church get fired up, thenen watch the sinners come to the altar. We needed new births in the pulpits and pews of Amenerica. More old-time hell-fire and repentancece preaching. Church members and preachers will have to be born again themselves beforere they can see new births among those

outsitside. 2.2. In this Pentecostal revival the 120 discipleles obeyed the Lord. He told them to "tarry in J Jerusalem until they were endued with powwer from on high." If we would see Holy Ghoost revivals today we, too, must obey the Lord in all things and tarry until we receive the Holy Ghost. Mind the checks of the Spirit. If HHe sends you out to call from door to door with your Bible under your arm, and with traccts and Gospel literature, obey Him. If He wannts you to take all the blame, even though your are not to blame, say, "Amen, Lord, I will!." Then watch the revival fires begin to burin. Then see how the coldness will be lifted from the atmosphere in your church. See how God will then begin to pour out His Spirit on the services. How your altars will be filled with penitent, weeping souls!

3. The next thing that I notice about this first Pentecostal revival is that they were all

with one accord in one place when the fire of the Holy Ghost fell upon them. Ah, yes, that is it. "Behold how beautiful and how pleasant it is for brethren to dwell together in unity! It is like the precious ointment upon the head, that ran down upon the beard, even Aaron's beard: that went down to the skirts of his garments" and then filled the atmosphere all around with sweet aroma. There you have a picture of a church with that beautiful spirit of oneness in its ranks. You need never fear from the enemy without, it is the enemy within that causes all the trouble in your church. Let all the members of any church get sanctified wholly and there is sure to be unity there. Some preachers are afraid to invite a holiness evangelist to conduct a revival in their churches for fear it will split the church. How strange! Did you ever hear of a husband and wife loving each other so increasingly and so dearly day after day until they finally had to get a divorce? It would be just as reasonable to think that as to think of a church being so sanctified and filled with perfect love and the Holy Ghost that they fell out with each other.

4. Then there was much prayer in this first Pentecostal revival. They prayed for about ten days. I imagine, too, that there was much heart-searching and confessing to God and to one another during that ten days of prayer. I could not conceive of anything else. Any time a hundred twenty people meet together for ten days of prayer as did these early disciples, you may depend upon it that the Lord will be faithful to them and show them what they must do in order to get rid of those things that hinder the coming of His blessed Holy Spirit.

If you would see a real Holy Ghost revival in your midst someone or more must "give birth" to it. Someone must agonize. As we travelled along a certain highway I read a sign, "Advertise or fossilize." A fossil is a petrified skeleton of a one time living creature. The publicity concern meant that sign for business men, but I wish to take the same words and add some to them and apply them to the church thus: "Agonize, evangelize and advertise or your church will fossilize." Many a church is made up of old fossils, both in the pulpit and pew. Even some holiness people are saved, sanctified, petrified and fossilized. They are a million miles from the faintest trace of a revival. Oh, for more agonizing in the pulpits of this country. "When Zion travailed she brought forth her children."

5. And lastly, the early church was baptized with the Holy Ghost and with fire. This preceded the conversion of the three thousand. If every church in America would tarry for this enduement of power we would see a nation-wide revival that would be greater than any other in the history of the world. Oh, for a Spirit-filled ministry. More ministers like Barnabas, "a good man, full of the Holy Ghost and faith." Then the natural result will

IN CHINA
