The question was raised, and considerable discussion followed, of the problem affecting some pastors in leaving their churches over a Sunday to attend Quarterly Meeting.

The meeting passed a resolution that it might go on record as being opposed to the government control and sale of alcoholic beverages. The secretary was instructed to write letters stating such to the Premiers of Nova Scotia and New Brunswick.

The secretary was also instructed to write Mrs. Brander, of Northport, expressing interest in, and appreciation for her efforts to further the work of the Lord in her community; also a letter to the Halifax Mission inviting them to send a representative to the next quarterly meeting on this district.

A motion was passed suggesting that each Sunday school give one offering a quarter for extension work in the district, the proceeds to be known as the District Extension Fund. The secretary of the quarterly meeting, Lic. W. H. Mullen, was appointed treasurer of the above fund until the next quarterly session.

A vote of thanks was extended to the Amherst people for their care and consideration of visiting delegates and preachers.

The motion was made and carried to accept the invitation of the Westchester church for the next quarterly meeting.

Saturday evening Lic. W. H. Mullen was the speaker. His subject was "A Faithful Saying," based on the text found in I. Tim. 1:15.

Sunday morning the "Love Feast" was conducted by Lic. Alice Sterritt, who spoke refreshingly on Nahum 1:7. The morning sermon was preached by Lic. Hubert McGeorge, who used as his text Heb. 9:22, showing the divine remedy for the prevalent sins of the day.

In the afternoon Lic. W. H. Mullen spoke on the subject: "Some Keys to a Successful Christian Life." The message was followed by the observance of the Lord's Supper.

The Quarterly Meeting came to a climax Sunday evening, when, with the church well filled, Rev. J. A. Owens brought a stirring message on "Hell." God blessed the sermon, and conviction was on the meeting. One person raised his hand for prayer.
