EDITORIAL

THE BIRTHPLACE OF REVIVAL

In his famous book, "Revival Lectures," Charles G. Finney declares "A revival of religion is as naturally a result of the use of the appropriate means as a crop is of the use of its appropriate means."

We believe that there is support for this claim in the history of the great revivals of this Holy Ghost dispensation. A review of accounts given of the "times of refreshing" which have come from the presence of the Lord in the past, brings to light certain facts which lead us into agreement with this principle stated by Finney.

This story is invariably the same. The need of revival was impressed on some heart or hearts, certain steps were taken by those so impressed, and God came to bless.

Perhaps the primary need of the hour is the heart-gripping conviction of the need of revival. So long as we are content that things continue as they are, there will be little improvement. The hope of revival will be born at the hour when someone begins to be disturbed over the state of things as they now exist, when some heart becomes anxious and troubled concerning the lukewarmness of the church and the sinfulness of the world.

Long ago a prophet of God was aroused to the need of his people and the threat of Divine judgment, and he cried out in agony of spirit: "O Lord, revive thy work in the midst of the years . . ." At another time a servant of God, learning of the desolation and hardships which his people were suffering, said: "I sat down and wept, and mourned certain days and fasted, and prayed before the God of heaven." Still another, awakened to a realization of the desperate plight of the land, put the trumpet to his lips and called for a fast and solemn assembly saying: "Let the priests, the ministers of the Lord, weep between the porch and the altar, and let them say, spare thy people, O Lord, and give not thine heritage to reproach." To all these burdened, troubled, prayerful souls came the hope or realization of revival. Habakkuk says: "God came from Teman, and the Holy One from Mount Paran. His glory covered the heavens, and the earth was full of His praise." Nehemiah saw the

holy city rebuilt and the waste places inhabited and Joel received the promise of the former and latter rain.

O that God would move us with strong desire for the reviving of His work! "Stir me, O Lord, stir me, I care not how, but stir my heart in passion for the world." Let this be our prayer.

OUR SCHOOL

Now that the date for the opening of our Bible School has been set, let us all co-operate to support the enterprise.

Woodstock, N. B., has been chosen as a temporary location for the school, and a staff of teachers has been employed. High School subjects, a Grade XII. course, a Bible course, and music are offered to students who attend the school this year. Any who desire to take the Bible course and some High School subjects will be able to do so, and a full Grade XII. course is offered. The latter is adapted to the needs of High School graduates who wish to further their academic studies. The musical training will be available to all students.

Pastors and people are requested to give every assistance to make this vitally important project a success. If all will give zealous and unselfish co-operation, we may see the dream of years come true, a Bible School of our own where our young people may prepare themselves for their life's work.

Pastors can help by "selling" the school to their people. It is the task of the ministry to encourage and stimulate the interest of the people in the venture and enlist students. The laity can help by responding to the business manager's appeal for supplies and equipment necessary to the normal function of such an institution. All can help by supporting this effort by prayer, gifts and moral support.
