GOD IS ALWAYS ON TIME

"For the vision is yet for an appointed time, but at the end it shall speak, and not lie; though it tarry, wait for it: because it will surely come, it will not tarry" (Heb. 2:3).

Habakkuk's time was much like our own. He saw goodness outraged, cruelty rampant. His soul was stirred within him as he cried out to God against the flagrant injustices of the aggressor. And then Habakkuk went alone to his watchtower. As he spread the matter before the Lord, the answer came introduced by your text for today. The Vision, the fulfillment of justice, says God, is for an appointed time. Though it seem to the prophet to tarry, he is to wait for it; it shall surely come, it will not tarry. In other words, from man's point of view the vision is tardy of fulfillment, but from God's point of view it is precisely timed. "It will surely come, it will not tarry."

Oh, the comfort of knowing that our God is never late! We may long for His intervention; we may even accuse Him, as did Habakkuk, of letting evil flourish unrebuked. Nevertheless, His hand is never tardy. At the appointed time He intervenes. His time is, out of all eternity, the one perfect time for action. So let us put aside anxiety. God will not be late in keeping His appointments for mercy and judgment.—Dr. Frank E. Gaebelein
