YOUTH IN ACTION

Throughout the land we rejoice to observe a genuine spiritual awakening, and it is significant that the various church youth organizations are the leaders in this turning to the teachings of Christ. We mention one instance: The National Conference of the Methodist Youth Fellowship held August 24-30 in Michigan, set as a goal the winning of one million young people for Christ during their Crusade for Christ campaign.

In another issue we have already referred to the growing Youth for Christ movement in Canada and the United States. From the Religious News column of the **Herald of Holiness** appears the following comment:

"Will the Youth for Christ movement which is doing so much good in keeping the "bobby sox" group off the streets Saturday nights, and presenting Christ to them in an informal manner, become a permanent organization, or is it just a solution for this pressure war period? At Winona Lake in July they formed an international organization. They enlarged the scope of their activities to include "an invasion of the English-speaking world with the Gospel through Youth for Christ." They are "gearing" their organization for city-wide revival campaigns. It is not to be set up as a new church, neither is its rallies in 5,000 American cities to be like a "Church service." It is not a new denomination, society or a school. It is an inroad into the ranks of youth to interest them in the salvation of their souls and is an answer to juvenile crime and delinquency. All we can say now is, "Bon Voyage" Youth for Christ!"

In this wishing of "Bon Voyage" we heartily join.

From across the water comes an item somewhat in contrast to the cheerful note sounded above. During the Swedish Baptist Association held in Stockholm, several speakers made mention of the prevailing "pleasure-craze" which seemed to hold the youth of Europe in its grip.

One speaker said that the war had not "brought the spiritual re-awakening for which many had hoped."
