The Pastor's Message

Theme: The Cost of the Journey.

Text: Jonah 1:3. "He paid the fare thereof from the presence of the Lord."

The character of our sermon is the prophet Jonah, whom God had called to go and warn Nineveh, that wicked city of nearly two million souls, and the burden of his message was: "Yet forty days and Nineveh will be destroyed." Now Satan, the devil, that arch fiend of hell, is always around to make faces at God's people, trying to scare them from doing the task God calls them to do. Jonah had heard how that this city was exceedingly great and exceedingly wicked and, through this scowl of the devil, Jonah took shipping to Tarshish and paid the fare thereof from the presence of the Lord.

There are three kingdoms that men have to do with. Each one has what is known as legal tender or medium of exchange, as its standard of values. Our temporal kingdom's standard in this country is dollars and cents. All our temporal values are judged by this standard. Then there is the kingdom of Satan whose legal tender is death. "The wages of sin is death." Yes, death while yet physically alive. This is the condition of every sinner. Then there is the kingdom of God's dear Son, the kingdom of heaven, whose legal tender is the "Grace of God." Now Jonah is not the first nor the last one that has paid the fare from the presence of the Lord. Not the first one that has allowed the devil to change the legal tender of the kingdom of heaven, for the legal tender of death.

In the Word of God is pictured the attitude of Christ, coming to help me and to save men, for his prayer on the cross was: "Father, forgive them for they know not what they do." Jesus recognized that as sin was unnatural, sinners were unnatural, off balance, morally perverted, insane. What! You say these men that crucified Christ were insane? Surely they were insane, putting to death the one who wanted to be their Saviour. Any man is insane when he will continue to accept from Satan his legal tender which is Death, Spiritual Death. Surely Jesus was right when he said these men "know not what they do." The fact that He was the Son of God but incited them on. The Purity of Christ added to their frenzy until they became murderers of the best friend man has ever known, Jesus the Saviour.
