Letters from Our Pastors

Dear Highway Friends,

Greetings in Jesus name.

It seems that rather a semi-annual report is due from us at this time, as it has been quite a while since we occupied any space in our good paper. We will try to be as brief as possible.

The first special effort of our new church year began in September 1945 when we were privileged to have Sister Laura Walker and her mother, Mrs. T. W. DeLong, from Waltham, Mass, with us, for a meeting. They both proved a real blessing to our church.

Sister Walker had the most beautiful scene-o'felt pictures of the Bible, accompanying her messages and song, that the church had ever seen. Her work among the children and young people was also very impressive. Souls were saved and sanctified in this meeting, who are still going on, and enjoying God's blessing.

had "turned the grace of God into lasciviousness." We are aware that many present day church leaders resent even the suggestion that our world is not growing better, but we are also aware of the fact that data gathered from the four corners of the earth present a rather dismal picture. Germany is floundering in a sea of destruction. Her murderous attempt has been repulsed, and frightful judgments have fallen upon her own people. Russia arises on the world's horizon as a threat to permanent peace. This fact in itself is sufficient proof that the Christian spirit in that land is all but extinct. Asiatic countries are in a constant state of turmoil, while England struggles to regain her national prestige and America grapples with an unprecedented crimewave. The world is staggering under a burden that grows heavier every twenty-four hours.

Jude tells us where to look for the cause. Germany had her revival of Deism, and her religious leaders have recently reported upon the justice of her judgments. Russia knew her long years of commercialized religion. The church grew rich through trafficing in souls. Then the populace arose in contempt of all claims to a supernatural religion and as a result Russia won for herself the undesirable title, "The Land of the Godless". In this land of ours, we have no reason to be shocked today when our young people pass by our churches on their way to the Sunday Movies, and the modern night-clubs. For the past twentyfive years or more, we have paid educators in our State Universities to rob them of their faith in God and everything supernatural. Even in our great church organizations, no man could get a peep into office unless he was an avowed modernist. These things make for a harvest of infidelity and atheism and we are reaping it today in real earnest. The past six years however, have thrown us back a bit, and many of our teen-agers are finding their way back into the evangelical churches. This is the most hopeful sign that I see anywhere on the church calendar. We pray there may be life enough in the churches, to whom they turn, to lead them straight through to a heart experience of saving grace. The Church is challenged today and her answer to the challenge will determine the outcome. Christ and history agree in this: When the spiritual thermometer of the Church rises, the moral standards of the nations rise, and when the spiritual life of the Church wanes the morals of the Nations take a plunge downward. "Ye are the salt of the earth, but, if the salt has lost its savor, wherewith shall it be salted." Its preservative is gone when the Church loses her God-given salt. Hence, Christ has always been more concerned about the condition of the Church than the condition of the world. The remedy for Jude's dark day was to be found in the Church. "But ye beloved, building up yourselves on your most holy faith." The remedy is to be found, if found at all, among the best. Jude is writing to the sanctified. The sanctified hold the key, and the key is an increase of spiritual life. "A building program" among the sanctified. This saved the world in Luther's day; this saved England in Wesley's day; thsi saved New England in inney's day; and if our day is to be saved, it will be saved by the same means. The work of redemption will begin in the Church and will be universal enough to exert an influence of saving power sufficient to lift the world. As I read the Scripture I am led to believe, that one of the things which will hasten the Great Day of the Lord will be a loss of faith and power in the Church which renders her incapable of being

a salvation factor in the earth. According to Peter, "The husbandman waiteth for but one thing; the precious fruit of the earth." When this no longer is being realized sufficiently to satisfy the holder of events, the end will come.

I think there is more than a hint of this in Jude's epistle. Associated with conditions referred to, he quotes from a former prophecy, "Behold the Lord cometh with ten thousands of His saints, to execute judgment upon all." The whole chapter seems to bear a "Last Day" setting. Would to God the whole Protestant church would arise and put on such a building program of spiritual power that the world would know once more, before Christ comes, what a revival of salvation can do toward correcting this world's ills. Will you be one that will help to begin it? Will I?

"NON-MISSIONARY IS NON-CHRISTIAN"

William Adams Brown, whose name is almost synonymous with "foreign missions," used to silence all thinking objectors in his audiences with this striking apologetic:

1. Every book in the New Testament was written by a foreign missionary.

2. Every letter in the New Testament that was written to an individual was written to a convert of a foreign missionary.

3. Every Epistle in the New Testament that was written to a church was written to a foreign missionary church.

4. The disciples were called Christians first in a foreign missionary community.

5. Of the twelve apostles chosen by Jesus, every apostle except one became a missionary.

6. The only one among the twelve apostles who did not become a missionary became a traitor.

7. The problems which arose in the early church were largely questions of missionary procedure.

8. According to the apostles, missionary services is the highest expression of Christian life.—Sel.
