would be the holy of holies, and the special article of furniture there, which was the symbol of the divine presence, was the ark of the covenant. The lid of this ark of pure gold was called the mercy seat, and upon it at either end were two golden cherubim." Arnold's Commentary. It was in the holiest place that God manifested his glory and power. Shew from Heb. 10:19-23 that it is the privilege of all believers today to enter into the holiest (the very presence of God) by the blood of Jesus.

February 3, 1946 FEAST DAYS OF A PEOPLE

Lesson: Lev. 20:7, 8. 23-46, 15, 16, 24, 27, 28, 34, 39-44

Golden Text: "The Lord hath done great things for us, whereof we are glad."—Psalm 126:8.

COMMENTS ON LESSON V.

In the book of Leviticus we have descriptions of the different sacrifices, the consecration of priests, the various kinds of uncleanness and their purification; the festivals, vows, tithes, etc. It is God's purpose to produce a holy people.

7. Sanctify yourselves.—"Ye shall keep yourselves separate from all people of the earth, that ye may be holy; for I am holy. And this was the grand design of God in all these prohibitions and commands: for these external sanctifications were only the emblems of that internal purity which the holiness of God requires here, and without which none can dwell with him in glory hereafter."—Dr. Adam Clarke.

8. I am the Lord which sanctify you—Sanctify means (1) to purify, free from sin. (2) to set apart as holy, for some sacred purpose; consecrate. Winston universal reference library. It is through the Eternal Spirit that man is purified and consecrated to God. Heb. 9:14.

4. Holy convocations.—A calling (together).

5. In the fourteenth day of the first month at even is the Lord's passover.—The Feast of the Passover was held in remembrance of Israel's deliverance from Egypt. It kept fresh in their minds God's mercy in sparing their first-born, while all the first-born of the Egyptians were destroyed. The destroying angel spared the Hebrews because they put blood upon the door posts.

6. And on the fifteenth day of the same month is the feast of unleavened bread.—Unleavened bread is made without yeast and was eaten in memory of the circumstances in which the children of Israel left Egypt. They left in such a hurry that they took their dough before it was leavened.

15. And ye shall count unto you from the morrow after the Sabbath fro mthe day that

ye brought the sheaf of the wave offering; seven Sabbaths shall be complete.—This is the institution of the Feast of Pentecost. It was observed fifty days after the Passover and was probably held in memory of the giving of the law at Mount Sinaii, which was fifty days after leaving Egypt. The sheaf of the wave offering.—The priest waved a sheaf of barley before the Lord in the beginning of harvest. It was to ever remind them of God's providence in supplying all their physical needs.

16. A new meat offering.—"meal-offering" R. V. It stood for gratitude to God as giver of all.

24. Blowing of trumpets.—The seventh month was most of September and part of October and marked the beginning of the civil year. The trumpet is symbolic of a call. Today we have the call of the gospel trumpet to repentance and worship.

27.—Also on the tenth day of this seventh month there shall be a day of atonement. The day of atonement is fully described in Lev. 16. Its objective was not to remind the people of present or past mercies, but one great all important lesson—the need of reconciliation: Twice on the day of atonement alone did the high priest enter into the most holy place, once for himself and his house, with the blood of a bullock; later for the people with the blood of a goat. Putting his hands on a second goat he confessed over it all the sins of the people. This second goat was led away alive into the wilderness where no man dwelt. These two goats taken together prefigure the human and divine nature of Christ. The first being killed prefigured his death in punishment for our sins and the second (scape-goat) his resurrection.

34. Speak unto the children of Israel saying, "The fifteenth day of this seventh month shall be the feast of tabernacles for seven days unto the Lord.—There were three great annual festivals in the Jewish year, The Passover, Pentecost and the Feast of Tabernacles. The latter is in memory of the time that the children of Israel dwelt in portable booths, or tents, or tabernacles, when journeying from Egypt to Canaan. It is another reminder to the people of the mercy of God in the preservation of life while travelling through the wilderness.

40. And ye shall take you on the first day the boughs of goodly trees, branches of palm trees, and the boughs of thick trees, and willows of the brook; and ye shall rejoice before the Lord God seven days.

42. Ye shall dwell in booths seven days.—
"Originally, the purpose of these branches was to make booths, as is shewn by Neh. 8:15, 16. They were to re-enact the conditions under which the children of Israel lived in the wilderness." Higgley's Commentary.
