A New Life. Rom. 6:4: "Therefore we are buried with him in baptism into death; that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we should walk in newness of life."

A New Name. Rev. 3:12: "Him that overcometh will I make a pillar in the temple of God, and he shall go no more out: and I will write upon him the name of my God and the name of the city of my God, which is New Jerusalem, which cometh down out of heaven from my God: and I will write upon him my new name."

New Mercies. Sam. 3:22-23: "It is for the Lord's mercies that we are not consumed, because His compassion failed not. They are new every morning: great is thy faithfulness."

New Fruits. Ezek. 47:12: "And by the river upon the bank thereof, on this side and on that side, shall grow all trees for meat, whose leaf shall not fade, neither shall the fruit thereof be consumed it shall bring forth new fruits according to his months, because their waters they issued out of the sanctuary: and the fruit thereof shall be for meat and the leaf thereof for medicine."
