It does not give "freedom" to disregard the Word of God, the Spirit of God, or the Son of God, but makes their triple leadership a delight.

It does cleanse the heart from "all sin."

It does impart perfect love, which casteth out all lavish fear of man, of foes, of death, of hell, and of the judgment.

It does make "dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God."

It does fill with the Holy Ghost.

It does make "more than conqueror."

It does eliminate all irritability, evil tempers, murmuring, fretting and repining.

It does so destroy the "old man" of sin and "cast him out" of the heart that his motions are no more felt.

It does eliminate the "bear," the "snapping turtle" and the "peacock," and replace with the lamb, the lily, and the lion.

It does eliminate stinginess and crown liberality.

The birth of the Spirit brings pardon; the baptism with the Spirit, purity.

We read in Deborah's song of victory where she praises certain tribes, reproves others, then curses Meroz: "Curse ye Meroz, said the angel of the Lord, curse ye bitterly the inhabitants thereof; because they came not up to the help of the Lord, to the help of the Lord against the mighty." Jud. 5:23. These people were not antagonistic, but were in some respects patriotic; yet they were easy going and carnally secure. Mark you! Their sin was not disloyalty, nor treason, but feebleness of spirit and being satisfied with present attain-

ments. Sad, but we have seen this same accursed people today. They sit and drink in the truth, yea, support it in various ways. But there is no passion or burden for souls. They seldom if ever help around the altar, and know little about hanging on in prayer for hours until Satan is routed and sweeping victory comes.
