THE SUPPLEMENTARY FUND

Many of our Highway readers are familiar with the purpose of our Supplementary Fund and how the money received for this fund is used. There are no doubt many others who have not been receiving the Highway for many years who are not acquainted with particular place this Fund has in the ministry of the Highway. For these readers we print the following explanation.

No paper can pay for itself with subscription payments only. Therefore, gifts to the Supplementary Fund help to subsidize what may be lacking through our subscription income.

A PREVIEW OF OUR 1948 HIGHWAY

Rev. R. H. Ingersoll, Young People's Editor, will edit the Young People's Page, bringing messages and information of special interest to young people. Special features are in store for this important section of our Highway.

Rev. F. A. Dunlop Evangelist, and denominational Superintendent of Evangelism, will write for each issue of The Highway more of the "Tempered Truths," series, helpful discussion of great truths practical and doctrinal.

Rev. R. B. Warren, Principal of Lorne Park College, Port Credit, Ontario, whose brief, helpful messages are carried in a score of publications, religious and secular, will continue to supply his soul-nourishing articles for our Highway.

Dr. J. B. Chapman, late General Superintendent of the Church of the Nazarene, "being dead, yet speaketh," will minister to our Highway readers through the written messages he left behind to enrich the world. Through the courtesy of the publishers, Beacon Hill Press, we shall publish a series of messages from Dr. Chapman's book, "Religion and Everyday Life."

Dr. J. A. Huffman, well-known preacher and writer, formerly associated with the faculty of Marion College, Marion, Indiana, and at present president of Winona Lake School of Theology, writes a series of articles for The Highway in which he unearths treasures of truth by interpreting New Testament scriptures from the Greek texts. W. Butler, Dr. Harry Jessop, Dr. Peter Wiseman, and others; **"Ministers and Churches,"** the news column regarding activities of our ministers and their churches, announcements of special services, baptisms, reception of church members, etc.; and the regular Wedding, Birth and Obituary Announcements of interest to our Highway readers.

This long list of features makes The King's Highway of 1948 something to look forward to. We pray that the ministry of this herald of the Gospel of Grace may be wonderfully blessed of the Lord during the New Year.
