# CANADIAN HOLINESS FEDERATION CONVENTION

The fourth convention of the Canadian Holiness Federation was held on the Gospel Worker's fine camp ground, August 29th—September 1st inclusive. While the attendance was the smallest, because of the great distance from the larger church centers, yet the blessing of God and fellowship of the saints was of a high order.

The Gospel Worker's Church had just closed their annual Camp, and the Camp Meeting atmosphere, together with the fine welcome extended the delegates, made the Convention feel at home.

Bro. Hamilton had things well in hand and

in every service showed his fine executive ability. He is stepping down to vice-presidency after four years of leadership. Rev. E. H. Thompson of the Standard Church was elected as our new President. Rev. W. A. McMillan of Toronto, representing the Holiness Movement Church, is the new secretary.

Bro. Thompson gave a report on his visit to the Canadian Council of Churches held in Quebec City. He was asked to attend the Council this year with the thought of the Federation being represented by a church service on the Council's broadcast.

Feeling the need of added funds, beyond that received through participating membership, to carry out its work, the Federation voted to raise by subscription, at the Sunday morning service, at least five hundred dollars, and also ask each church to have a Federation Sunday on which an offering will be taken. Each pastor will receive a communication from the Federation secretary.

Dr. Couchevour, President of the National Holiness Association was guest speaker for the Federation. His messages were thoughtprovoking, soul-inspiring and characterbuilding. Each message brought truth that if applied would build definite Christian experience. The great missionary rally Sunday afternoon was a source of blessing. Dr. Puffer, missionary for the Free Methodist Church on furlough from India, spoke of his work, also of the conditions in India. He told of a Holiness Federation formed there and that among other Holiness bodies there was one known as Reformed Baptist Church who teach and promote our doctrine. With Dr. Puffer was a native preacher who also is a District Superintendent. Rev. E. S. Timothy spoke English fluently as well as three other of the languages of India. He gave us an idea of the price a person of his country must pay in accepting Jesus as Saviour and break away from the heathen religion.

Monday afternoon and evening was devoted to the Canadian Holiness Youth Association and their speaker was Rev. Quinton Everest of South Bend, Ind. The Young People's delegate will be reporting their part of the Convention.

We feel that this report comes far short of expressing what the Convention meant to us. We appreciate the privilege of acting as your delegates. This Convention brought home with greater force the statement of Jesus in John 10:16 "And other sheep I have, which are not of this fold: them also I must bring, and they shall hear my voice; and there shall be one fold, and one shepherd." "Holiness unto the Lord."
