NO TIME FOR COMPROMISE

The subtle sources of evil, sin and wickedness would have every church and every Christian on the face of the earth to compromise God's truth, righteousness and holiness with them, and thereby become weak and powerless. This is indeed no time to compromise. If ever we stood for truth and righteousness, firm and undaunted, it ought to be now.
