### DEAF PEOPLE REACHED WITH GOSPEL MAIL BY MAIL

A gospel ministry by mail to deaf people (those who neither speak nor hear) in the United States and Canada is carried on by a Christian brother in Minneapolis, Mr. Julius K. Hoffman. His mailing list now includes 10,000 names. There are about 125,000 deaf people in the United States and Canada. Mr. Hoffman, deaf himself, has a real burden for the deaf, and writes letters or sends free tracts and gospel literature to those not reached through the churches.
