# ANNOUNCING THE NEW "CROSBY MEMORIAL CHAPEL"

Those who have visited our School know how great has been the need for an enlarged Chapel. The garage, which has been used for Chapel services, was much too small for our growing student body, and gave us no opportunity to encourage people outside our school to worship with us. This, as you very well know, is not the way we would have it.

When the School Board met last September this matter came up for consideration. After some discussion, the Board decided to provide some suitable building to meet the above stated need. Rev. Ingersol and I, were appointed to carry out the wishes of the Board.

Now, to provide the building was a small task, but to pay for the building, was quite a different matter. Knowing, the heavy financial burden our people are under, we wondered where money would come from to meet the need. The men were at work, orders for material were being placed, the Chapel was going up, but where was the money to be found? Well, anything can happen when God is taken into account.

Mrs. George Crosby, whose generosity is well known to our people, thought to make a gift toward this project to the amount of Two Thousand Dollars, (\$2,000). Hence, we are dedicating this building in memory of her late husband, George Crosby and Mrs. Crosby, to be known as the "Crosby Memorial Chapel". Well, I say, praise the Lord!

I think nothing in years has strengthened my morale as has this magnificent gift. We like to know that the people have confidence in our enterprises, and who could question this confidence in the face of such gestures as we happily announce. Our Denomination owes a vote of gratitude to this good woman.

We will be sending a picture of the Chapel to the editor of our paper for publication so soon as the building is completed. The size of the building is forty by twenty-seven. It has a pitch roof; a tower, that serves also as an entry; it will be lighted with fluorescent lighting, and all in all, will fill a large place in the spiritual life of the School. I think Rev.
