BETHANY BIBLE COLLEGE



Under the new name, "Bethany Bible College", our school took up its quarters in this very spacious and majestic looking building in September of 1947. The building, located in Yarmouth, N. S., is ideally situated on the summit on one of Yarmouth's few hills and is just one block east of the Canadian Pacific Railway station. A ten or fifteen minute walk will place one in the centre of the town's shopping district. Because of its fine location one gets a most wonderful view of Yarmouth from the tower, the surrounding country, and on out over the salt waters which lap at the shores of Nova Scotia. Besides the large tower and spacious basement, this three storey building contains over twenty rooms and five large hallways. Other buildings on the three acres of land include a two storey 20' x 25' building which houses our Chapel and is used as High School class rooms, a three-room bungalow, a small green house, a garage, a well kept barn and three small buildings. Out beyond these buildings is a large tract of land which will make an ideal athletic field. In summer, the grounds around the main building are made beautiful with flower beds, spacious lawns and giant shade trees.
