- 1. Realize that God is giving you an opportunity to return to Him in a small measure His gift to you.

- 3. Don't be slothful. Keep the welfare of your society first on your heart.

- 6. Be diligent. Always endeavour to be at the church on time. Be faithful. Rain or shine, cold or hot, be in your place.
- 7. Don't "programme" your meetings too much. Keep a spirit of freedom by changing the order of the service now and again.
- 8. Don't ask anyone else to do anything you would not be willing to do yourself.
- 9. Keep a sound holiness emphasis behind each service.
- 10. Don't let the song service drag. Keep it lively, but don't speed the singing enough to lose the value of the message.
- 11. Use different methods of conducting services such as having readings one night, Bible Quizzes another, a simple talk by a member another, etc.
- Above all realize your dependence on God and seek His leadership and guidance. Spend much time in prayer.
