THE HARMONY OF HOLINESS

neither will He set His seal upon the service of an unholy person. He that doeth righteousness must be righteous, even as He, the Lord is righteous.

The labors we are to perform are clearly shown, when it is written, "... be ye holy, for I am holy." The service from an unsanctified soul never can reach this requirement. If we are to serve Him in holiness and righteousness, all the days of our lives, it will require a deliverance, and not a mere dedication. "Your sanctification" is the will of God. That will is righteousness revealed, and righteousness required. Paul discloses the righteous acts consistent with the sanctified, when he says, "That ye should abstain"; and again he uses the word "abound" (see context). I marked these two words to show that the will of God INWORKED in the heart that is sanctified, is the law of righteousness that urges us to

"ABSTAIN" from passion's way. The righteousness of His will is fulfilled in this perfect order, it ABOUNDS in every good work, and it ABSTAINS from the very appearance of evil.

Sanctification Is the Reign of the Will of God

The fact of His reign runs through the whole range of truth; it is the hope of the gospel, and the hope of glory. Christ in us is the central fact of sanctification. Perfect love, pure living, and patient labors are evidences of His righteous reign. "Christ liveth in me," is the high noon of holiness. This is why some are called, "saints in light."

We need to meditate upon what this involves in its scope. We know that Christ is to have complete control over all that we are; He is to be the one Lord, and none shall dispute His rights. If He cannot rule, He will not reside. His reign is our rest. Now indwelling sin is enmity with God; it voices its viciousness, saying, "We will not have this man rule over us." Sin is not subject to the law of God. The carnality of the heart is high treason against God; to suppress it, or counteract it, as some erroneously teach, is no solution to the problem of the antagonism of indwelling sin.

No possible reasoning that would appear consistent with truth can allow sin to remain, and argue that God is willing to have it remain. He will not, nor does not, reside in the carnal heart. He destroys sin that He may dwell supreme. What I set forth here has to do with the finished work of God's will in the heart.

I am fully aware of that sense in which the Spirit is in regenerated persons; I am also aware of the fact that the conflict which the Spirit has with the sin that dwelleth in us is not God's perfect will. He has made full provision to eradicate sin and enthrone Himself Lord of the heart. In no other sense is His will supreme. Sanctification is in this very fact, the He reigns without a rival in the soul. This is the conquest of Christ, and is the crowning work of His redemptive will. In no other way can Christ be all and in all!
