panting thirst of the human soul. Edward Smith, a great Methodist evangelist, requested in his will that on his tombstone there should be these words:

Edward Smith, who was satisfied in Jesus

Talking to the woman by Jacob's Well, Jesus said to all other waters that they failed to satisfy; but He said, "Whosoever drinketh of the water that I shall give him shall never thirst; but the water that I shall give him shall become in him a well of water springing up into eternal life." If these things be true, how does it come to pass that there are so many unsatisfied and dissatisfied Christian people in the world? Is it, as they say in Lancashire, that they "sip and never sup?" If any man thirst let him come unto me and drink, drink, drink!

The Promise of Rivers

Sanctification is only part of the promise. In the heart of the satisfied is the source of

rivers of living water. Rivers spring from deep waters. At their source they seem but tiny springs but their sources are deep among the eternal and inexhaustible supplies. Another wonderful thing about rivers is the way they gather as they go. Rivulets, mountain streams, drains, and water from all sources come rippling, tumbling, flowing to the river. In the southern hills of Scotland, there arise near together two tiny streams, one flowing east and the other flowing west, which become the mighty rivers Tweed and Clyde. Jesus promises a life like the flowing river to those who come and by abiding faith are satisfied in Him. There is nothing very promising about those who come. Their only qualification is a big thirst, but a big thirst is a big thing, and a big thirst satisfied makes possible still bigger things. This is the law of Living Waters. They flow out of a big thirst satisfied to overflowing. They run over.

All people who have been greatly blessed of God to this parched and thirsty world have been overflowers. Their lives have not been run by machinery, by oil or by petrol, but by living water from the Eternal Source of all life and love, joy and power. It is the joyous overflowing that tells. All workers among the

poor have shining faces, because they have overflowing hearts. Rivers! Think of it! Not a pump by the way, not a swampy marsh with an occasional pool, not even a river, but rivers! It takes one's breath away, but it is true, every word of it. Rivers! Think of them. Name them. Trace them. Even an archangel cannot tell the blessing that may flow from the sanctified life of a soul with a big thirst satisfied in Jesus.

The evangelist gives an explanation that reveals a secret and a condition. This spake He of the Spirit. It is the Spirit-filled who are satisfied in Jesus, and from whom flow rivers of living and life-giving water; and He is given when and where Jesus is glorified.—Heart and Life.

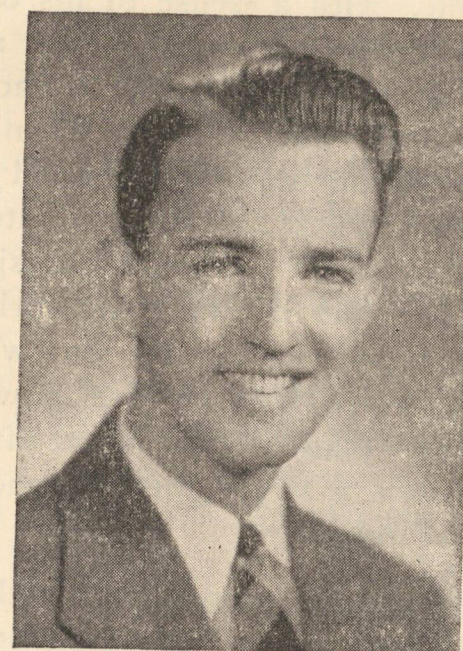

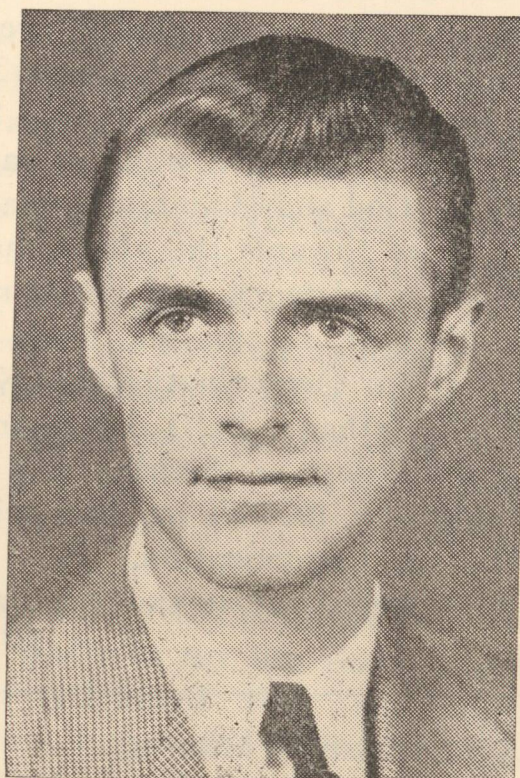
